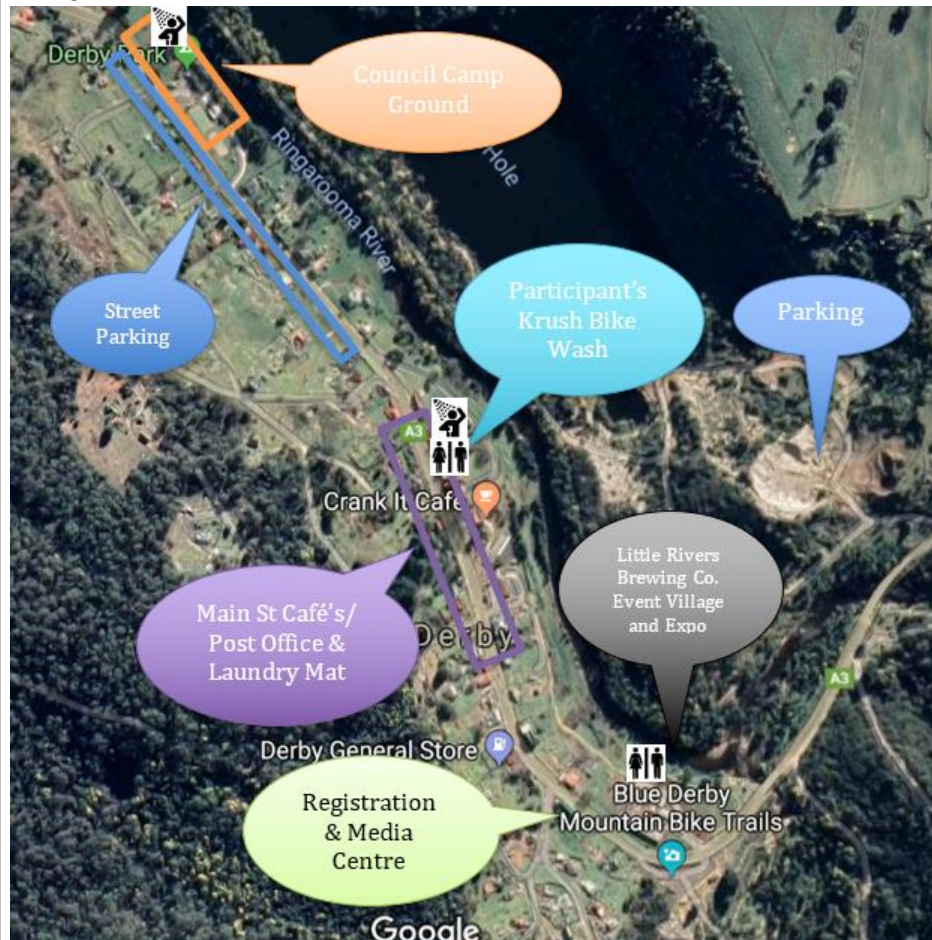

EWS and EWS100: £112.50

Entries include all taxes and processing fees.

Entries will be processed through the centralized Enduro World Series entry system in Pounds Sterling (GBP). The Enduro Sports Organization Limited is acting as agent for Event Management Solutions Australia.



Entry fee includes 2 day race, 1 day of closed course marshalled training, full course medical coverage on training and race days, race day feed zone, race day neutral tech support, live timing, backup timing.



CANCELLATION POLICY

Registration fees are refundable (less an administrative fee) up to 3 weeks prior to the race. Cancellation request must be sent to athletes@enduroworldseries.com by 23:59 GMT March 8. Entries are no longer refundable after March 9. After this date, the registration proceeds are transferred to the organizer and the account is closed. Registrations are not transferable.



EWS MEMBERSHIPS

EWS memberships are valid for a calendar year (January-December). 2019 memberships can be renewed / purchased at: [LINK](#)

EWS

EWS Memberships mandatory for eligibility and event entry.

EWS100 and EWS80

EWS memberships are optional for EWS100 and EWS80 racers, but:

- Only EWS members will be eligible to collect EWS Global Ranking points at the EWS 100/80, EWS Continental Series or EWS Qualifier Series events. A rider must hold a valid EWS membership prior to starting the race in order to collect EWS Global Ranking points. No points will be awarded retrospectively should a rider purchase a EWS membership after an event.
- Only EWS members will be added to the EWS Reserve List and offered priority registration for the following season.



RACE LICENSES

EWS

The EWS is a UCI Category 3 race.

Riders will be required to present their licenses at the onsite checkin. Photos or electronic copies are acceptable.

International riders must have UCI licenses issued by their own national federations.

Australian riders can race on either a Cycling Australia UCI license or a MTBA license. Riders with an MTBA license will need to contact Cycling Australia to obtain a UCI ID. membership@cyclimg.org.au

EWS100 and EWS80

EWS100 racers will also need race licenses – but the requirements are a little more relaxed. Any race license would be accepted, including Amateur, Master, and Cycling for All licenses. Unlicensed riders can purchase a Day Licence at the onsite checkin. Cost \$33 AUD

Checkin Deadline. Riders who have not collected plate / checked in by 10h30 Friday will not be included on the Start List.

Altering, cutting, or placing of unauthorized stickers or sponsor logos on race plate is not permitted.

TIMING

Timing system: SPORTident AIR+ system

Timing chips will be issued from the timing tent on Saturday.

EWS racers should arrive at least 15minutes prior to their start time.

EWS100 and EWS80 racers will be provided with a scheduled time range to collect the chips on Sunday morning.

Each rider will be issued two chips (the second unit provides backup in case of loss or a crash). One chip should be worn on each wrist.

Timing transponders will be collected in the finish of the race.

Racers who withdraw or do not complete the race should return the chips to the finish.

Lost or damaged transponders will be assessed a 100 GBP replacement fee.



BIKE MARKING

Racers must use the same bike (frame, fork and wheels) for the race.

If one of these parts break (frame, fork, rear swingarm and wheels), riders have to report it to the race director. In the case of a replacement of a part or the entire bike, a 3-minute penalty will be given if the rider reports it to the race director (with the penalty assigned to the Stage when the replacement is made). If not reported, the rider will be disqualified.

Official event bike marking stickers (5 total) will be included in the race package.

Stickers need to be applied to the top tube of the frame, right side of the rear swing arm, right crown of the front forks and each wheel rim.

Do not affix the stickers until the race day.

Racers who lose their bike marking stickers prior to the race start may be assessed a time penalty.

Bike Marking only applies to EWS and EWS100 racers.

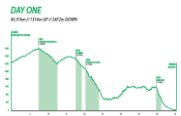

TRAINING

EWS, EWS100 and EWS80

To manage congestion on the tracks during training, there will be separate training times for EWS, EWS100 and EWS80 riders on the various stages. Refer to schedule for details.

Racer will be limited to 1 training run on each Special Stage.

Race stages are closed during official training to all but racers, media and official EWS Team staff. All riders on course during practice must have plates on their bikes. Any rider training without a plate or outside the official schedule will be disqualified.

Stage taping will be completed by Wednesday if rider wish to walk any of the tracks.



UPLIFTS

There are no shuttles for either training or race days. All transitions must be pedaled.



FEED ZONES

Riders will pass Feed Zone after Stage 4

The following will be available at the Feed Zone: apples, bakery items (muffins/danishes/iced fruit buns), Coke and water. Kooee Beef jerky will be available in the race packs to be used on race day

Water will be available at the Little Rivers Brewing Event Village.



TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ZONES

EWS

Technical Assistance is only permitted in the Technical Assistance Zone.

Racers will pass through the team pits after Stage 4.

EWS100 and EWS80

Outside assistance is permitted.



TOILETS

Toilets are available at the Little Rivers Brewing Event Village.

Public toilets are also located in the Main Street.



PROTECTION RULES

Full face mandatory during the special stages. A helmet with a detachable mouth piece is acceptable. Open face helmets can be worn during transitions.



RACE RULES

Riders are expected to read and understand the Race Book and Rule Book. Unfamiliarity will not be accepted as an excuse for any rule violation by any rider

The Race Director is authorized to give additional penalties that are not listed in the EWS rules in the case of a rider who fails to respect the other riders, the spirit of the sport, the environment or the organization.

Protests and complaints regarding the race, results, behavior of the other racers and any other sort of issue must be presented to the Race Director or Chief Commissaire within 15 minutes from the posting of the results.

START ORDER and SEEDING

EWS100 and EWS80

The riders in the EWS100 and EWS80 start groups will not have seeding, preassigned individual start times or fixed start intervals. Instead, the EWS100 and EWS80 racers will have a specific time period to complete each individual stages but they can start in any order within their group.

Riders in the EWS will have individual preassigned start times for the race

Riders will be seeded based on a combination of their current 2019 Enduro World Series rank, their final 2018 Enduro World Series and EWS Global Ranking, and (if applicable) EWS team status.

START LIST and START PROCEDURES

Any racer who has not checked in / collected their race plate by 10h30 Friday will be removed from the start list.

EWS

Start List (with individual start times) will be published after onsite checkin closes (10h30 Friday). Riders will be issued a sticker with their individual stage start times on Saturday before Stage 1 at the start platform . New stickers for Stage 2-6 will be issued on Sunday. Racers will have preassigned start times for all 6 stages.

Late racers will be given the following penalties:
up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty.
5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

Any racers arriving at the start of a race stage later than 30 minutes after their specified start time, or once all other racers in their category have started, will be assigned a DSQ for the race and should not complete any other stages.

A 1-minute interval will be added every 20-30 riders to allow a clear gap to start riders who have missed their start. All late riders must start, under instructions from the official starter, within each 1-minute gap. There is no fixed start interval between late starters as the goal is to keep late riders racing, without affecting other riders on course. Late starters will receive a fixed penalty

If a racer is delayed reaching the start as a result of assisting an injured rider or due to some other exceptional circumstances beyond the racer's control (which the rider can provide evidence for), the time penalty may be waived and / or the racer may be permitted to repeat the stage. Any racer affected by a 'significant incident' during a transition or special stage should immediately report to the finish or start official of the affected stage (as applicable).






The Race Director has the final right to change start times during the race in case of any unforeseen circumstance.
