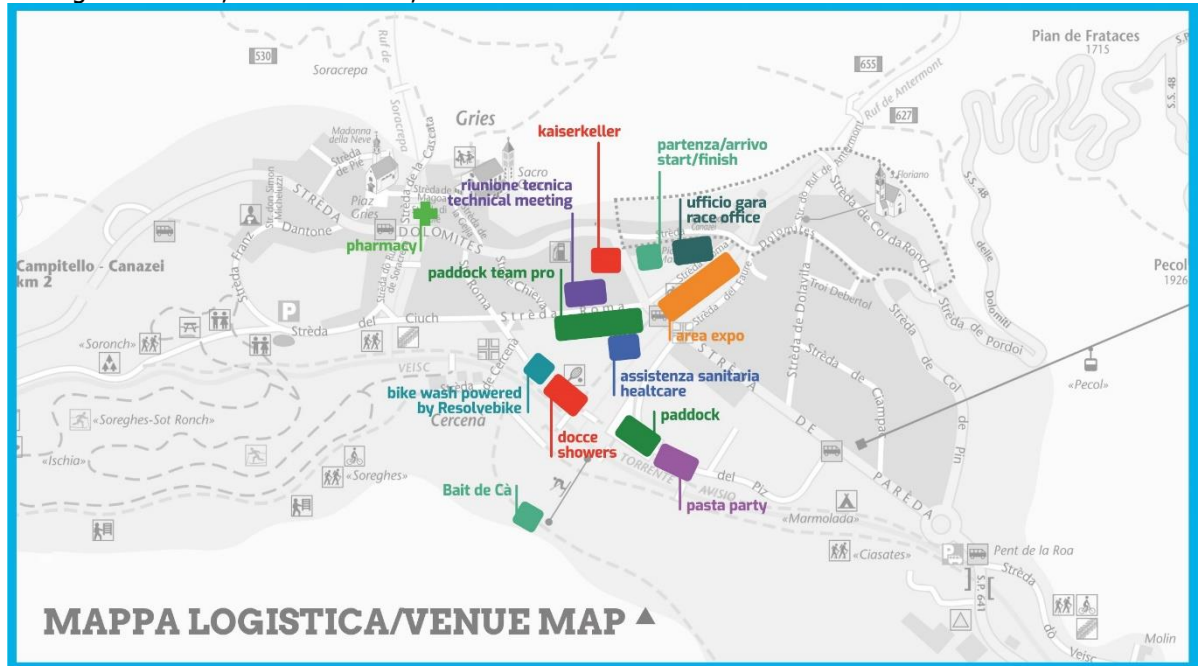

TIMING

Timing system: SPORTident AIR+ system

Timing chips will be issued from the timing tent on Saturday.
EWS racers should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their start time.
EWS100 racers will be provided with a scheduled time range to collect the chips.

Each rider will be issued two chips (the second unit provides backup in case of loss or a crash). One chip should be worn on each wrist.

Timing transponders will be collected in the finish of the race.
Racers who withdraw or do not complete the race should return the chips to the finish.

Lost or damaged transponders will be assessed a 100 GBP replacement fee.



BIKE MARKING

Racers must use the same bike (frame, fork and wheels) for the race.
If one of these parts break (frame, fork, rear swingarm and wheels), riders have to report it to the race director. In the case of a replacement of a part or the entire bike, a 3-minute penalty will be given if the rider reports it to the race director (with the penalty assigned to the Stage when the replacement is made). If not reported, the rider will be disqualified.

Official event bike marking stickers (5 total) will be included in the race package.

Bike Marking applies to both EWS and EWS100 racers.

Stickers need to be applied to the top tube of the frame, right side of the rear swing arm, right crown of the front forks and each wheel rim.

Do not affix the stickers until the race day.

Racers who lose their bike marking stickers prior to the race start may be assessed a time penalty.

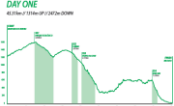

Any racer found riding any stage outside of official practice hours for their specific training group will be disqualified.

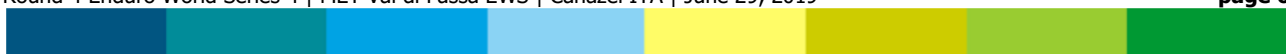

	<p>UPLIFTS Course will feature a combination of lift accessed and pedalled transitions. Lift tickets are included in the entry fee – valid 4 days (from Wednesday to Saturday) on all lifts in Canazei, Alba and Campitello. (Regular rate is 31€/day). To use the pass, riders must have bike plate attached to bike. Lift operating times 08:30 – 17:30</p>
	<p>FEED ZONES Feed Zone + water point at the paddock area (after Stage 3) Following will be available in the Feed Zone: fruits, cakes, bread, jam, cheese, chocolate, cola Water will be available at the start of stages 1, 2, 3, 4, 5</p>
	<p>TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ZONES EWS Technical Assistance is only permitted in the Technical Assistance Zone (Paddocks). Racers will pass through the TAZ after stage 3. Racers will not be permitted to obtain assistance at any other time during the race. EWS100 Outside assistance is permitted.</p>

Any racer who has not checked in / collected their race plate by 10h30 Friday will be removed from the start list.

EWS

Start List (with individual start times) will be published after onsite checkin closes (10h30 Friday). Riders will be issued a sticker with their individual stage start times on Saturday morning at the start platform . Racers will have preassigned start times for all 5 stages.

Late racers will be given the following penalties:

up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty.

5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

Any racers arriving at the start of a race stage later than 30 minutes after their specified start time, or once all other racers in their category have started, will be assigned a DSQ for the race and should not complete any other stages.

A 1-minute interval will be added every 20-30 riders to allow a clear gap to start riders who have missed their start. All late riders must start, under instructions from the official starter, within each 1-minute gap. There is no fixed start interval between late starters as the goal is to keep late riders racing, without affecting other riders on course. Late starters will receive a fixed penalty

If a racer is delayed reaching the start as a result of assisting an injured rider or due to some other exceptional circumstances beyond the racer's control (which the rider can provide evidence for), the time penalty may be waived and / or the racer may be permitted to repeat the stage.

Any racer affected by a 'significant incident' during a transition or special stage should immediately report to the finish or start official of the affected stage (as applicable).

The Race Director has the final right to change start times during the race in case of any unforeseen circumstance.

EWS100

Once EWS100 racers leave the start, EWS100 racers will need to complete the balance of the stages in order, but they will not have preassigned individual start times or fixed start intervals for any of the following race stages. Rather, EWS100 rider will have a specific time period to complete each individual stages as well as an overall time to complete the course each day.

Opening / closing times for each stage will be published after registration closes on Friday.

If a rider does not complete the course within their final time check, they will have a 5 minute penalty added to their overall time.



	<p>OTHER RIDING OPTIONS All race stages are closed for riding until Thursday</p> <p>Unfortunately the options are a limited at the moment . Extensive trail damage was caused by a wind storm this past winter – and trail crews have not had a chance to remove fallen trees/debris as the focus has been on preparing the tracks which we will used for the race.</p>





	<p>Below are a few recommendations from the organizers / local trail association for options which have not been impacted by the wind storm and which should be clear of snow.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-in Val Gardena the Ciampinoi trail under the Ciampinoi cable car in Selva di Val Gardena. Reachable by bike from Campitello gondola. Easy to do laps-Burz trail from Passo Pordoi towards the Rifugio Burz above Arabba. To do laps riders have to take the gondola in Arabba towards Portavescovo and then a cable car from Pont de Vauz back to Passo Pordoi- from Portavescovo the Padon trail towards Rifugio Padon, then down towards Passo Fedaia, final trail to Canazei starting under the dam (called Via Neva). CAUTION: On this final trail, riders should be careful as the trail has sustained some winter damaged and for few meters the riders must walk as the trail has collapsed.-the Sellaronda tour, a long loop, mainly lift supported, riding varies a lot from natural trails to fireroads, in general the riding is mellow- xc loop around Sassolungo, from Campitello gondola mountain station anti-clock direction <p>Re trailfork. NOTE: many of them are interrupted by fallen trees (sometimes one tree, sometimes 50 trees in several areas along the trail). Trailforks reports / status may not accurately reflect condition of trails .</p>
