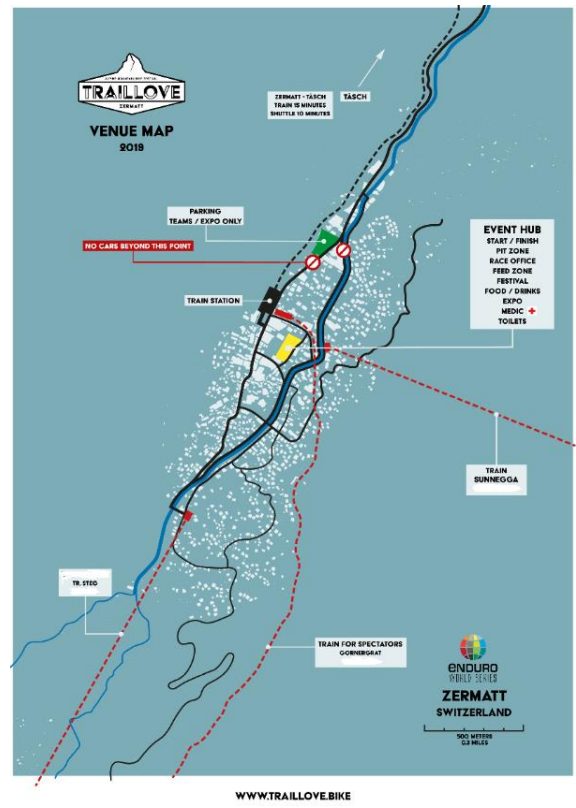
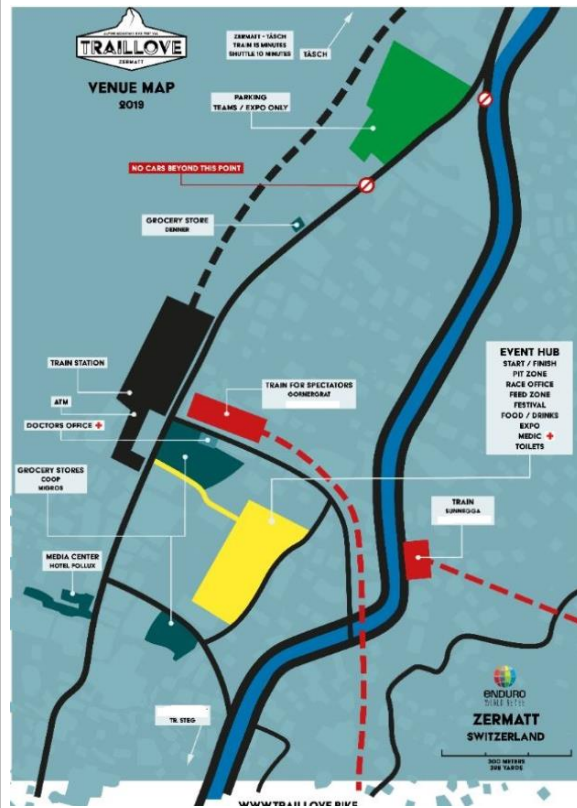

To compete in the EWS race, riders must prequalify (based on EWS Global ranking points) or be part of an official EWS team. Entries closed.

EWS100

Non-members and EWS Members without minimum required ranking points.

Entry fee includes 1 day of racing, 1 days of closed course marshalled training, full course medical coverage on training and race days, lift pass valid for 4 days (Wednesday to Saturday), race day feed zone, race day neutral tech support, live timing, backup timing, end of series party (Saturday).

Entry fees include all taxes and processing fees

Entries will be processed through the centralized Enduro World Series entry system in Pounds Sterling (GBP).

The Enduro Sports Organization Limited is acting as agent for TRAILLOVE



CANCELLATION POLICY

Registration fees are refundable (less an administrative fee) up to 3 weeks prior to the race.




Cancellation request must be sent to athletes@enduroworldseries.com by 23:59 GMT August 30.

Entries are no longer refundable after August 31.

Registrations are not transferable.

Altering, cutting, or placing of unauthorized stickers or sponsor logos on race plate is not permitted.



TIMING

Timing system: SPORTident AIR+ system
Timing chips will be issued from the timing tent in the Event Hub on Saturday morning.
Racers should arrive at least 15minutes prior to their scheduled start time to collect the chips.

Each rider will be issued two chips (the second unit provides backup in case of loss or a crash).
One chip should be worn on each wrist.

Timing chips will be collected in the finish of the race. Racers who withdraw or do not complete the race should return the chips to the timing tent in the finish.
Lost or damaged chips will be assessed a 100 GBP replacement fee.

BIKE MARKING

Official event bike marking stickers (5 total) will be included in the race package.

Stickers need to be applied to the top tube of the frame, right side of the rear swing arm, right crown of the front forks and each wheel rim.







Do not affix the stickers until the race day.
Racers who lose their bike marking stickers prior to the race start may be assessed a time penalty.

Racers must use the same bike (frame, fork and wheels) for the race.

If one of these parts break (frame, fork, rear swingarm and wheels), riders have to report it to the race director.










	<p>In the case of a replacement of a part or the entire bike, a 3-minute penalty will be given if the rider reports it to the race director (with the penalty assigned to the Stage when the replacement is made). If not reported, the rider will be disqualified.</p>

	<p>TRAINING All stages will be closed for riding from the course announcement on Sunday September 15 until official training on Friday September 20.</p> <p>Crews will start taping on Monday September 16 to have everything ready on Thursday.</p> <p>Except for the last part of Stage 5, there are no restrictions walking the race stages. Last part of Stage 5 crosses a bike park track - but can still be walked with extra caution.</p> <p>To manage congestion on the tracks during training, there will be separate training times for EWS and EWS100 riders. See schedule. Racer will be limited to 1 training run on each stage.</p> <p>Race stages are closed during official training to all but racers, accredited media and official EWS Team staff. All riders on course during practice must have plates on their bikes. Riders will be issued a sticker with their individual stage start times on Saturday morning at the start platform in the Event Hub.

Late racers may be given the following penalties:

up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty.

5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

Any racers arriving at the start of a race stage later than 30 minutes after their specified start time will be assigned a DSQ for the race and should not complete any other stages.

A 1-minute interval will be added every 20-30 riders to allow a clear gap to start riders who have missed their start. All late riders must start, under instructions from the official starter, within each 1-minute gap. There is no fixed start interval between late starters as the goal is to keep late riders racing, without affecting other riders on course.

EWS100

Once EWS100 racers leave the start, they racers will need to complete the balance of the stages in order, but they will not have preassigned individual start times or fixed start intervals for any of the following race stages.

Rather, EWS100 riders will have a specific time period to complete each individual stages as well as an overall time to complete the course each day.

Opening / closing times for each stage will be published after registration closes on Friday.

If a rider does not complete the course within their final time check, they will have a penalty added to their overall time.

Late racers will be given the following penalties:

up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty.

5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

GENERAL

If a racer is delayed reaching the start as a result of assisting an injured rider or due to some other exceptional circumstances beyond the racer's control (which the rider can provide evidence for), the time penalty may be waived and / or the racer may be permitted to repeat the stage.

Any racer affected by a 'significant incident' during a transition or special stage should immediately report to the finish or start official of the affected stage (as applicable).

The Race Director has the final right to change start times during the race in case of any unforeseen circumstance.

START ORDER and SEEDING

EWS100

EWS100 uses a fastest first format.



Racers will be assigned a start position for the first stage based on the information in the "Self Seeding" section of their EWS Rider Profiles (1 Super Fast | 2 Fast | 3 Good | 4 Pure Fun) .

EWS100 racers can also request to be paired up with teammates / friends for the start (even from different categories). *EWS Rider Profile > User Navigation > Additional Racer Info > "Paired Rider"*

Once EWS100 racers leave the start, they are not required to remain in the original start positions for the balance of the stages.



All current UCI and WADA anti-doping rules and regulations are in force. It is each rider's responsibility to check whether he or she has been selected for doping control. Lists with racers' numbers and/or positions will be posted on the timing tent in the the finish line as well as at the Doping Control Station (DCS).</p>
	<p>PROTECTION RULES Full face helmets and knee pads mandatory during the race stages. A helmet with a detachable mouth piece is acceptable. Open face helmets can be worn during transitions.</p>
