EWS riders will be automatically registered for two separate races.

Met EWS Val di Fassa #1 (EWS Round 1)

23 June: EWS (prequalified and EWS team riders only) . 4 stages

Met EWS Val di Fassa #2 (EWS Round 2)

25 June: EWS100 and EWS80

25-26 June: EWS (prequalified and EWS team riders only). 1 stage Friday, 4 stages Saturday

### **EWS100 / EWS80 RACE LICENCES REQUIREMENTS**

EWS100 and EWS80 racers should review the license section for the unique license requirements established by the Italian Cycling Federation.

### **EWS80 CATEGORIES**

Due to Italian Cycling Federation regulations, Youth categories will not be offered in the EWS80 Val Di Fassa race. Minimum age 17 (year of birth 2004)



### **TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS / ITALIAN ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

#### **DISCLAIMER**

The information about Italian entry requirements / exemptions is a summary of the current [published Italian rules and regulations](#). Entry into Italy is not guaranteed . Regulations and rules may change without notice - and they remain subject to the assessment of Italian border control officers.

Also please note that even if you are permitted to enter Italy pursuant to an exemptions, you may be subject to restrictions upon return to your home country following the Val Di Fassa race. Riders would need to check with their own national health authorities for applicable policies.

Similarly, riders planning to transit through or travel to any other countries before or after the Val Di Fassa race would need to verify any potential entry restrictions, quarantine requirements, test / vaccine requirements, curfews, travel documentation, ... - and make their own determinations as to how these might apply to their own personal / individual situation.

#### [Italy Ministry of Foreign Affairs:](#)

Travellers arriving from EU countries, the Schengen Area, Great Britain and Israel can enter Italy without having to observe compulsory quarantine provided that a negative result was obtained from a molecular or antigenic swab taken no more than 48 hours prior to entry into Italy.

There are also exemptions in the Italian entry / self-isolation [requirements](#) for foreign competitors participating in sporting events.

p. In order to participate in sporting events such as those mentioned under article 18, paragraph 1 of PMD of March 2 2021, entry is always permitted to athletes, commissioners, referees, foreign press and alike, irrespective of their travel history, if the following mandatory requirements are met: They must fill out a self-declaration; they must carry with them a certificate proving that they have taken a molecular or antigenic test carried out by means of a swab, in the 48 hours before entering Italy, with negative result. Sporting events must take place in accordance with relevant health and safety protocols adopted by the organization responsible for the event.

Personalised invitation letters referencing these regulations will be issued during the week of May 31 to all foreign racers who do not qualify under the EU/Schengen/Great Britain exemption.

## COVID CHECKPOINT / EVENT ACCREDITATION

Accreditation will be issued from the COVID Checkpoint.

Sunday from 14:00-19:00

Monday 7:00- 12:00 and 14:00-18:00

SS48, tent in front of [Hotel Caminetto](#)

Starting Tuesday, COVID Checkpoint will move to the entrance of Paddock B.

Racers can collect the accreditation on behalf of other riders if they have the completed Self-Declaration and negative COVID test results.

## NEGATIVE COVID TEST RESULTS

All racers (as well as any individuals applying for Yellow Zone access accreditation) will be required to present a negative PCR or Antigen test result, carried out a maximum of 72 hours in advance in order to collect their event accreditation needed to access the restricted event zones.

Racers will need to go to the COVID Checkpoint first in order to get their accreditation before accessing the Registration Office (located in the Yellow Zone) . Refer to schedule for Covid Checkpoint and Registration Office hours.

Testing requirements apply to everyone receiving event accreditation - including individuals that are fully vaccinated or have proof they recovered from the virus.

Antigen testing can be arranged at a local pharmacy. Advance appointments required.

Note that there might also be additional / different testing requirements if you are travelling by air or other commercial carriers, transferring to any other countries on your way to or from Italy, and upon returning home. You would need to make your own inquiries and determination as to how these might apply to your own personal / individual situation.

## SELF-DECLARATION

All racers (as well as any individuals applying for Event Hub access accreditation) will be required to present a completed Italian Ministry of Health [Self-Declaration](#)

## FACE MASKS

Masks must be worn at all times in the Yellow Zone (including the individual team paddocks)  
It is also mandatory to wear a face mask on any lift/gondola

## COVID SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Safety protocols document (posted on [event page](#)) outline essential guidelines designed to minimize the risk of transmission of COVID-19 among participants in the Val di Fassa EWS. We'll continue to review and update our policies to adhere to the most up-to-date practices to keep participants safe.

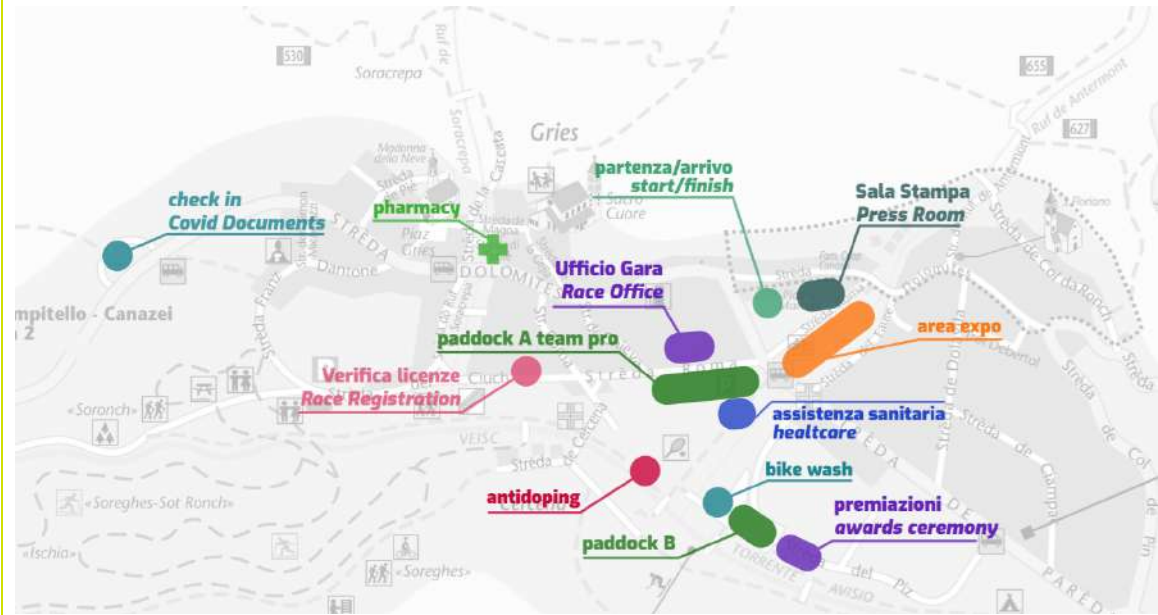

Access to the zone is limited to racers, registered teams/exhibitors/sponsors, race officials, accredited media and event staff

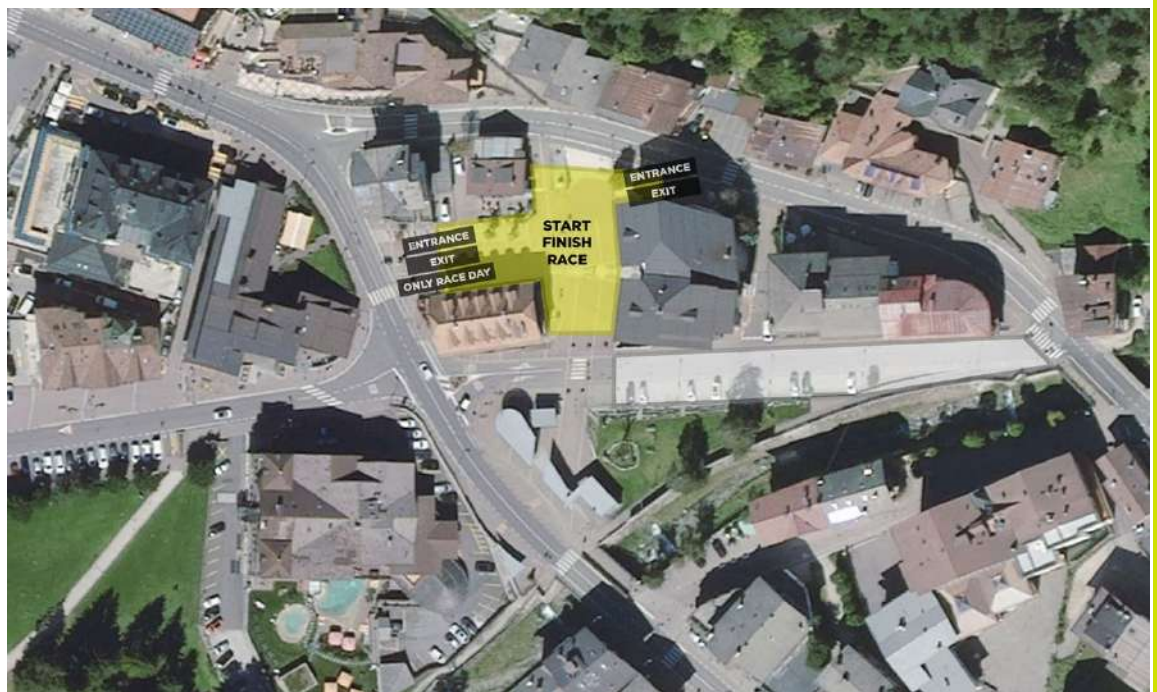
Accreditation (and testing / Self-Declaration) is required

### FCI AMOTORI JUNIOR SPORT

Italian riders with a FCI Amatori Junior Sport (JMT or JWS) license are not eligible to race in the EWS100/80.

Any Italian racer born in 2003 or 2004 will need to have a race license for professional sport (FCI JUNIORES license category)

### DAY LICENSE

EWS100/80 racers who do not have an annual license from their own national federation can purchase a one event license from the FCI Italian Cycling Federation .

Licenses will be available from the Val Di Fassa race office during onsite checkin.  
Cost 10EUR per day. Separate licenses needed for training and race days.

Day Licenses are not available for junior (year of birth 2003-2004) racers . All EWS100/80 junior racers must have a race license issued by their own national cycling federation.



#### **NOTICE - MEDICAL CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENT FOR DAY LICENSE PURCHASE**

In order to purchase a day license from the Italian Cycling Federation, riders will need a medical certificate ([sample format](#)) which meets the following conditions:

- issued within the previous **12 months**
- certifying fitness for **competitive cycling**. Certificates for other types of sport such as triathlon, duathlon, athletics, etc. are not valid.
- [DataHealth verified](#) . The verification of the possession of an adequate medical certificate must be made in advance through the online DataHealth service. Riders will be required to upload their medical certificates to DataHealth ([instructions](#)) and obtain a Qrcode-DH (which verifies the adequacy of the certificate). The Qrcode-DH will be required in order to purchase a one event license at the onsite Val Di Fassa race checkin.

**The DataHealth validation process can take up 3-4 days - please allow sufficient time in advance of the race to obtain the Qrcode-DH.**



### INSURANCE

All costs of transportation from the venue during training / race days to a medical facility are covered by the Italian National Medical Assistance.

FCI insurance covers medical costs associated with injuries occurring during training or race.

Racers are not covered for any injuries occurring outside of official training or race times, any specialized medical transfers from Italy to their home country or for any extended medical / rehabilitation treatment. The event insurance is therefore not a replacement for a racer's own personal travel / medical insurance.

**CHECKIN / PLATE COLLECTION**

Race Package will include plate (must be on bike for training and race) plus bike marking stickers and jersey number. Stickers and jersey numbers only needed for the race day. EWS racers will use the same plate decal for Race #1 (June 23) and Race # 2 (June 25-26). Separate bike marking stickers will be issued for Race #1 (black) and Race #2 (white).

To collect the package on behalf of another racer, a copy of the racer's identification and race license or Datahealth verified medical certificate (as applicable) is required.

Lift ticket collection EWS100/80. Tickets will be included in the Race Packages during registration . Racers arriving early can collect tickets. Stages closed for riding . Refer Recommended Riding Zones for other options.

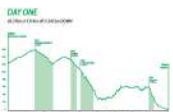

### TRAINING




### EWS100 and EWS80




To minimize congestion on the tracks, the race start will be staggered. Each EWS100 and EWS80 racer will have an individual assigned time to leave the start / Paddock.

Once EWS100 / EWS80 racers leave the start, the racers will need to complete the balance of the Special Stages in order. But there are no specific stage start times for the EWS100 or EWS80 races.
