RACE 1 COURSE CHANGES

Following adjustments have been made to the course for Race 1:

(see MAP for details)

- -Dolmens stage canceled. La Pique is now the Queen stage
- -liaison from Privilege to Pourticou has been adjusted to avoid overlap with La Pigue. From bottom of Privilege, racers will pedal paved / gravel road to connect to Pourticou
- -Pourticou shortened. Finish at final fire road. Racers will descend fire road to connect to blue trail to Paddocks / TAZ

-20 minutes has been allocated for assistance in TAZ between Pourticou and Val D'Aube.

DISCLAIMER

Regulations and rules may change without notice.

Also please note that even if international riders are permitted to enter France, they may be subject to restrictions upon return to their home country following the Loudenvielle race. Riders would need to check with their own national health authorities for applicable policies.

Similarly, riders planning to transit through or travel to any other countries before or after the Loudenvielle race would need to verify any potential entry restrictions, quarantine requirements, test / vaccine requirements, curfews, travel documentation, ... - and make their own determinations as to how these might apply to their own personal / individual situation.

COVID ACCREDITATION and SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Accreditation will be required to access Event Hub.

One of the following documents must be presented in order to receive accreditation:

- vaccination certificate (One dose sufficient, Pfizer / Moderna / AstraZeneca : carried out at least 2. weeks in advance or Janssen: at least 4 weeks in advance)
- certificate of recovery (11 days in advance, within the previous 6 months), or
- a negative PCR or Antigen test result (carried out a maximum of 48 hours in advance of the



checkin)

COVID test center will be set up next to the Race Office Open daily from Monday 30 August between 9:00-11:30. Results available in the afternoon. 50€ for foreign riders (no cost for French riders - included in national health insurance)

Masks are mandatory on the Skyvall and Privilege lifts.

Everyone has a critical role and a shared responsibility for creating a healthy environment and a safe event. We are relying on all racers, staff, volunteers, and members of the host community to consistently and properly follow personal protective practices.



ENTRY FEE

Entry fees include all taxes and processing fees

Entries will be processed through the centralized Enduro World Series entry system in Pounds Sterling (GBP). The Enduro Sports Organization Limited is acting as agent for the local organizer Luchon Louron Cyclisme



Entry fee includes live timing, backup timing, welcome pack with special gift, feed zone every day on event site (sweet and savory dishes), full course medical coverage on training and race days, free medical and recovery services, free parking.

EWS (includes Race #1 2 September and Race #2 4-5 September): 371.95 GBP 2 separate races (3 days of racing), 2 days of closed course marshalled training, lift access on gondola Skyvall and chair lift Privilege from Tuesday 31 August - Monday 6 September, shuttle on Saturday 4 September PRO Stage race

EWS100/EWS80: 175.25 GBP

Entry fee includes 1 day race, 1 day of closed course marshalled training, 4 days lift access on gondola Skyvall and chair lift Privilege from Friday 3 September to Monday 6 September.



CANCELLATION POLICY

Registration fees are refundable (less an administrative fee) up to 30 days prior to the race. Cancellation requests must be sent to athletes@enduroworldseries.com by 23:59 GMT August 2. Entries are no longer refundable after August 3.

Registrations are not transferable.

Memberships mandatory for eligibility and event entry.



EWS100/80

EWS memberships are optional for EWS100/80 racers, but:

- Only EWS members will be eligible to collect EWS Global Ranking points at the EWS100/80 races (as well as EWS Qualifier Series events).
- Only EWS members will be added to the EWS Reserved Entry List and offered priority registration for the following season.

A rider must hold a valid EWS membership prior to starting the race in order to collect EWS Global Ranking points. No points will be awarded retrospectively should a rider purchase an EWS membership after an event.

RACE LICENSE

EWS

The EWS is a UCI Category 3 race.

All racers must have a UCI license issued by their own national cycling federation. Riders will be required to present their license (copies or photos acceptable) at the onsite checkin.



EWS100/80

Non-licensed riders or riders with an FFC "Licences Loisirs et Performance" will be permitted to register upon presentation of a medical certificate (issued within the previous 12 months) certifying fitness for competitive sports / mountain bike racing .

The medical certificate requirement does not apply to EWS100 / EWS80 racers who have a UCI race license issued by their own national federation or an FFC "Licence Compétition".



PARENTAL AUTHORIZATION

Under 18 racers who do not have a race license will need to present a completed Parental Authorization Form.

Travel, medical and personal liability insurance coverage is not provided by the EWS Loudenvielle organisers or the Enduro World Series.

Racers are fully responsible for any medical or other costs that may directly or indirectly result from their participation in the Loudenvielle EWS/EWS100/EWS80 races.

Racers should have the following insurance coverage:

• Insurance for bodily injury (in and out-patient hospital expenses and medical care, transport costs, permanent disablement, death) and material damages (loss of earnings) in case of accident on the occasion of a cycling competition or during training.

• Third-party liability insurance for material damage or bodily injury caused to others in the course of a competition or cycling event or during training.

CHECKIN / PLATE COLLECTION

Race Package will include plate (must be on bike for training and race) plus bike marking stickers and jersey number. Stickers and jersey numbers only needed for the race day.

To collect the package on behalf of another racer, a copy of the racer's identification and race license or medical certificate (as applicable) is required.



HOURS:



Altering, cutting, or placing of unauthorized stickers or sponsor logos on race plates is not permitted.

TRAINING

Once the courses are announced August 28, all race stages will be closed for riding until training.

Race stages are closed during official training to all but racers, accredited media and official EWS Team staff. All riders on course during practice must have plates on their bikes. Any rider training without a plate or outside the official schedule will be disqualified.



Racer will be limited to 1 training run on each race stage.

To manage congestion on the tracks during training, each group (EWS and EWS100/EWS80) will have different days assigned for training. Stages will be open during designated times. Details will be published closer to the race date - refer to Schedule.




Safety Protocol: riders stopping on track to check lines or pushing up to session sections must do so from outside the tape.

UPLIFTS

Course will feature a combination of lift accessed and pedalled transitions.

LIFT ACCESS

Lift access is included in the entry fee.



EWS100/80: 4 days (Friday 3 September to Monday 6 September)





Racers should take a photo of the barcode on their lift ticket. Without this information, replacement for lost passes will not be possible and rider would be required to purchase a new pass.

SHUTTLES - SATURDAY PRO STAGE RACE

A free shuttle service will be available for EWS racers on Saturday to access the Tourtère PRO Stage start for the race.

Available from 13:30 to 16:00. Departure every 10 minutes.

Racers can arrange private shuttles

TIMING CHIPS

Timing system: SPORTident AIR+ system



Each racer will be issued two transponders (the second unit provides backup in case of loss or a crash). One transponder should be worn on each wrist.

Timing chips will be collected in the finish area of the race. Racers who withdraw or do not complete the race should return the chips to the timing tent in the finish area.

Lost or damaged chips will be assessed a 100 GBP replacement fee.

Timing stickers and timing chips will be issued at the start on race day. Racers should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their individual start time to collect the chips.

BIKE MARKING

Racers must use the same bike (frame, fork and wheels) for the race.

If one of these parts break (frame, fork, rear swingarm and wheels), riders have to report it to the race director.

In the case of a replacement of a part or the entire bike, a 3-minute penalty will be given if the rider reports it to the race director (with the penalty assigned to the Stage when the replacement made). If not reported, the rider will be disqualified.



EWS and EWS100

Official event bike marking stickers (5 total) will be included in the race package.

Stickers need to be applied to the top tube of the frame, right side of the rear swing arm, right crown of the front forks and each wheel rim.

Do not affix the stickers until the race day.

Racers who lose their bike marking stickers prior to the race start may be assessed a time penalty.



FEED ZONES

Location(s) and access will be confirmed after the course announcement.

Individual packages containing the following will be distributed from the Feed Zone on race days:

- 1 "sporty" bread roll, 1 ham and cheese sandwich (chicken breast on Sunday)
- 1 cup of tabbouleh (rice salad on Sunday)
- 1 cup of dried fruits
 - 1 bar of dark chocolate
 - 1 sprinkled almond bar
 - 1 banana or 1 apple

Sport drink from event partner ERGY SPORT will also be available.

Location of public water fountains will be identified on the course map.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ZONE



EWS

Technical assistance is only permitted in the Technical Assistance Zone / Race Paddocks. Riders are permitted to access the TAZ at any time during the race, but additional time will only be allocated after specific stages.

Details will be confirmed once the course map / start lists are published.

Riders in the EWS will have individual preassigned start times for all the stages.

Riders will be seeded based on a combination of their current Enduro World Series and EWS Global rank and (if applicable) EWS team status and PRO Stage prologue results. Previous Enduro World Series and EWS Global Rankings and results may be considered.

Start Intervals

Riders in the EWS will have individual preassigned start times for all the Special Stages. 30 second start intervals.

EWS100/80

EWS100/80 use a fastest first format.

Racers will be assigned a start position for the first stage based on the information in the "Self Seeding" section of their EWS Rider Profiles (1 Super Fast | 2 Fast | 3 Good | 4 Pure Fun). http://portal.enduroworldseries.com User Navigation > Additional Racer Info tab/menu

EWS100/80 racers can also request to be paired up with teammates / friends for the start (ever

EWS100/80 racers can also request to be paired up with teammates / friends for the start (even from different categories).

EWS Rider Profile > User Navigation > Additional Racer Info > "Paired Rider"

Once EWS100 and EWS80 racers leave the start, they are not required to remain in the original start positions for the balance of the stages.

START LIST and START PROCEDURES

List of registered riders published on the event page: "Participating Rider" tab/menu

Start List will be published the day prior to the race.

Any racer who has not collected their race plate by the checkin deadline will be not be added to the Start List.



EWS

Racers will have preassigned start times for every Special Stage.

Late racers may be given the following penalties:

up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty

5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

Any racers arriving at the start of a race stage later than 30 minutes after their specified start time will be assigned a DSQ for the race and should not complete any other stages.

EWS100 and EWS80

To minimize congestion on the tracks, the race start will be staggered. Each EWS100 and EWS80 racer will have an individual assigned time to leave the start / Paddock.

Once EWS100 / EWS80 racers leave the start, the racers will need to complete the balance of the Special Stages in order. But there are no specific stage start times for the EWS100 or EWS80 races. Rather, EWS100/80 riders will have a specific time period to complete each individual Special Stage as well as an overall time to complete the course each day.

Maximum course time and opening / closing times for the Special Stages will be published the day prior to the race.

If a racer does not complete the course within their final time check, they will have a penalty added to their overall time.

up to 5 minutes late = 1 minute penalty.

5+ minutes late = 5 minutes penalty

GENERAL

If a racer is delayed reaching a stage start or the finish time check as a result of assisting an injured rider or due to some other exceptional circumstances beyond the racer's control, the time penalty may be waived and / or the racer may be permitted to repeat the stage.

Any racer affected by a 'significant incident' during a transition or race stage should immediately report to the finish or start official of the affected stage (as applicable).

The Race Director has the final right to change start times during the race in case of any unforeseen circumstances.

TIMING CALCULATIONS

EWS100 riders who are EWS Members will be eligible to score Global Ranking points using the following calculation: EWS Series points equating finish place in scratch result with all EWS racers (excluding the EWS Pro Stage) - minus 20%.

EWS80 riders who are EWS Members will be eligible to score Global Ranking points.

The Global Rankings point scale for the EWS80 races are listed in Appendix 3.

PRO STAGE

EWS

Race #2 (4-5 September) will feature a PRO Stage: Tourtère

The Pro Stage will use a specially designed, high speed stage aimed to create close racing and excitement for spectators. The PRO stage will be raced on Saturday afternoon (S1) and repeated on Sunday (S6)



Bonus Global and Series Ranking points will be available for top 5 Men and Women and top 3 Masters and U21 of Saturday's stage result. Refer to Rule 1.2.6 for the complete points table.

Additionally, the top 5 racers in the Men's category and top 3 racers in the Women's category of the Saturday Pro stage will be reseeded to start last for the Sunday race.

Any other racer in the Men's category with a top 10 finish in the Saturday Pro stage will be reseeded if that racer has not previously been assigned to Group A for the Sunday's race. Racers transferring to Group A based on Pro stage results will be inserted at the end of the Group A Men's category before the Group A Women.

The Pro stage will be repeated as the final stage on Sunday but will not carry any bonus ranking points.

A racer who does not start the Saturday Pro stage will not be included on the start list for Sunday's race. Any racer who starts but does not finish the Pro stage will be assigned a time for the Pro stage (calculated as last place in their category plus 5 minutes) and will be permitted to complete the race on Sunday.

A racer with a DNF on the Pro stage will retain their star position / order for Sunday's race.

PROTECTION RULES



Racers must wear a full face helmet (either fixed or detachable chin pieces) at all times during the race - including liaison stages on the bike. It is not permissible to carry a second helmet attached to the pack / body.

Full fingered gloves, knee pads and a CE certified back protector are compulsory on race stages. A backpack can replace the back protector if it includes CE certified back protection.

The rules apply to both training and race days.

FILMING RIGHTS AND REGULATIONS

Play Sports Network Limited are the exclusive licensee of the EWS events organised by Enduro Sports Organisations Limited .

The filming, recording, broadcasting and distribution of footage of any activities associated with the EWS, including Shakedown, training, race or any other official scheduled activities, will be subject to regulation.

On board cameras must either be worn on peak / visors or affixed with a breakable mount. Chest mounts are not permitted.

DOPING CONTROL



Doping control will be under the authority of the <u>International Testing Agency</u>) for the UCI-sanctioned EWS race. All current ITA and WADA anti-doping rules and regulations are in force.

It is each rider's responsibility to check whether he or she has been selected for doping control. Lists with racers' plate numbers and/or positions will be posted on the timing tent in the finish line as well as at the Doping Control Station (DCS).



CONCUSSION PROTOCOL



Any racer who fails a concussion assessment by a qualified medical practitioner, during that event, will be removed from the current practice session or race and will be prohibited from further participation in any Enduro World Series race or practice session or race until cleared in writing by a medical doctor to resume such activity.

Should a concussion be confirmed by a medical doctor, the athlete is responsible for completing a 'graduated return to activity' plan.
